

When a disaster occurs, you need to evacuate quickly. Be prepared on a daily basis, with essentials packed into a backpack and stored where it's easy to retrieve.

Preparing for your pet is the owner's responsibility

Necessary evacuation supplies for your pet

- 3 days worth of food (dry food)
- 3 days worth of water
- Container (for food)
- Leash and collar
- Tools to collect waste
- Pet sheets



● Prepare a cage or carrier box

Prepare and mark your own cage or carry bag. By containing your pet in it, you keep them from escaping or becoming injured in an accident when evacuating.

● Pets must be properly trained

Evacuation sites will have many people. It's important to be mindful of people who have difficulties with animals, and to properly train your pet so it can wait when needed and will not make too much noise.



Domestic distribution and stockpiles

Always keep domestic distribution and stockpiles in mind

Buy a little more than you need of typical foods and essentials, so you have some when you need it.



The importance of preparing at home

Electricity, gas, water and other lifelines may be cut off, and a stop in supply lines is expected. Even those whose houses do not collapse may be forced to stay at home and live there for some time in these conditions, so each house should stock enough essentials at least for 3 days (ideally a week or so).

- The list below is the minimum you should try to have prepared. Each person should consider one's own needs and prepare accordingly.

Food

- Water (for cooking and drinking)
- Staple foods (rice, vacuum-packed rice, dry noodles etc.)
- Side foods (vacuum-packed foods etc.)
- Cans (meat, fish, vegetables etc.)
- Vegetable juice
- Things you can eat without heating them (Sausage, fish sausage, cheese etc.)
- Seasonings (miso, soy sauce, sugar and so on)
- Sweets
- Nutritional supplement foods

Living goods

- Flashlight
- Batteries
- Medication, standard and for chronic conditions
- Daily life water
- Radio
- Toilet bags
- Lighter
- Portable stove and gas cylinders
- Large and regular garbage bags
- Spare batteries for your cellphone
- Women's hygiene products
- Tissue paper
- Wet tissues
- Tarpaulin
- Disposable body warmers
- Packing tape

Be sure to stock up on anything else that would cause you trouble if you can't buy it!

The city will supply information through many means

Disaster prevention line (voice guidance)

The wireless disaster prevention line is easily affected by weather and the like, so it also offers voiced guidance (teledome) for people with hearing difficulties

Area Mail/Emergency Alert Mail

Planned evacuation center

Planned evacuation centers are facilities that are planned to open for evacuation temporarily, for those with no other recourse and a risk to their safety, in areas where a disaster has occurred or is expected to occur.

Reserve Evacuation Facilities

Reserve Evacuation Facilities are intended for when a disaster is about to occur or already has, and those forced to evacuate cannot fit inside established evacuation facilities, at which point these will open as temporary reserve locations to protect lives and physical safety of such evacuees.
